Progress in Paediatric Parasitology

Parasitic infections continue to exert a substantial impact on public health. Children in developing countries are particularly badly affected, but Europeans are also at risk through international travel, opportunistic infections in HIV patients and climate change.

The symposium will bring together a panel of invited speakers exploring the interface between medical parasitology and paediatrics. The meeting will take a disease-specific theme throughout and focus upon progress in clinical management, disease epidemiology and implementation of large-scale control programmes in the developing world.

Running over two days, the symposium will feature sessions on protozoan and helminth infections as well as an open poster session for attendees. Poster prizes will also be awarded.
